Aim of course

We are delighted to once again be able to offer this course in person, and welcome delegates back into the Royal College of Physicians of Edinburgh.

Our new format will vary between pre-recorded pre-course talks and live panel discussions of clinical cases. The pre-course talks will be available to registered delegates from Monday 27 February 2023 in advance of the course, and will be available for 12 months. In this way, we believe delegates will benefit from the close setting which the course has become known for, whilst including the 'library' of talks which has become so popular.

We have been pleased to run this comprehensive course in Edinburgh since 2000. It is designed for trainees in Clinical Oncology at the start of their preparation for the FRCR exam part 2 and trainees in Medical Oncology at the start of their preparation for MRCP(UK) Specialty Certificate Examination in Medical Oncology.
