## Eligibility Criteria

To be eligible to submit a story you should be working or volunteering in the field of global health – either in Scotland or overseas. We are particularly interested in promoting and recognising the efforts of NHS Scotland health and social staff and Scottish based organisations.

<u>Please note</u> – submissions will be reviewed and shortlisted by a small teams of representatives from Scot Gov, NHSS and academia. We reserve the right to publish or not publish any content you submit. If we need to contact you regarding your submission, we may contact you via the email address or telephone number you provide.
