

It uses the remarkable collections of the Royal College of Physicians of Edinburgh and its library - Scotland's oldest and largest medical library - to uncover the history of death. An original copy of Napoleon Bonaparte's post-mortem, written on Saint Helena Island, and a diary documenting the last days of celebrated Edinburgh physician James Young Simpson are displayed alongside a broadside proclaiming the execution of famous Edinburgh murderer William Burke.
